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INTRODUCTION

The Conscious Teaching Course is a UK Level 4 Diploma (EYE) delivered over two years part time. The course is suitable if you are looking for a recognised, validated qualification in early years care and education and wish to specialise in the Waldorf approach to early childhood.

- Wanting to become a group leader in a Waldorf kindergarten;
- Working in mainstream education but wishing to understand Waldorf principles and practice in the early years.
- Parents and Professionals wishing to support children holistically

QUALITY ASSURANCE & ACCREDITATION

In 2001, Highgate House School developed an international Steiner Waldorf Early Years training in collaboration with the International Association for Steiner Waldorf Early Childhood Education known as IASWECE to train teachers for the founding of the first Waldorf Kindergarten in Hong Kong. In 2017, we became a subsite of The London Steiner Kindergarten Training to deliver the Cache Level 4 Diploma in Steiner Waldorf Early Childhood Studies , qualifying graduates to be recognised as an Early Years Educator for all settings in the UK.

The new Crossfields Institute Level 4 Diploma (Conscious Teaching) was created with the addition of optional Extended Units, out of a need for an increased number of study hours, so as to be recognized in overseas teaching frameworks.

LOCATION

In person sessions are based at Highgate House School, the Peak in Hong Kong.

This beautiful location is situated on the Peak with open views of the sea and mountain, providing a retreat away from the city bustle.

Highgate House School was established in 1992 and has adopted a Steiner Waldorf curriculum since 2001.

Highgate House offers a library and comfortable and spacious classrooms for learning and sharing ideas. This comfortable workshop space with an open plan kitchen is on the ground floor main school. Our main classrooms are spacious and filled with natural light.





ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS

At this level, and with a part-time structure, there will be significant distance-learning requirements to enable students to produce sufficient evidence of their knowledge and understanding of the course content, and to satisfy the awarding body's standards for qualification. Applicants for the Level 4 Diploma should be sure that they are able to undertake monthly assignments, with both written and reading requirements.

Entry Criteria

Acceptance into the course is subject to availability and places are offered on a rolling basis. . Admission criteria are as follows:

- 18 years or older at the time of course start date
- demonstrate an interest in Steiner Waldorf education's principles and practice
- English and Maths at GCSE/local high school certificate or equivalent



ATTENDANCE

The course is a combination of tutor contact, online sessions, and distance learning. Students should be able to:

- Attend online sessions, practicum and short intensives of 1-3 days to make up the required number of contact hours. Saturday afternoons in person approximately once per month and intensives of 2-3 days approximately twice per year in Spring and Autumn.
- Find time for written and artistic assignments, supplementary reading and the compilation of a portfolio of evidence for validation
- Undertake observation for min. of 100 hours in Waldorf early childhood settings over Years One and Two.





APPLICATION PROCESS

Early application is advised; places are filled on a rolling basis. Once the course is full, we accept applications on a waiting list basis.

Step 1

Submit your completed application form and the administration fee of HK\$500 to admin@wellsprings.edu.hk

Please include proof of bank transfer or electronic reference. (Please include names and contact details of a referee with your application. As far as possible this should be an individual who can attest to your character and who has experience of you in a work or educational situation.)

Step 2

If the entry criteria is met, you will receive an invitation to an informal interview with one of our core tutors to discuss your application. This will take place either in person or via a zoom call.

Step 3

If you are accepted onto the course, you will receive an offer of a place, together with a contract, and further details of fees and the course structure. Your place will be confirmed once we have received your signed Acceptance Letter and initial fee payment.

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FEES & FINANCES

Years One and Two

These require the payment of an annual course fee in each year. Students are also required to pay a one-off accreditation & qualifying fee, applicants should ensure that they have the means to meet the fees before the application.


